

# Gates Foundation 2025 Open Access Policy Grantee Guide

## What ARE THE FOUNDATION'S OPEN ACCESS REQUIREMENTS?





**Effective January 1st, 2025, all grantees are required to post their funded manuscript as a preprint in a recognized preprint server.**

All preprints must be freely available and openly licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution license (CC BY) or equivalent terms to allow others to build on and reuse the research.

If a preprint has not been posted before article acceptance, grantees should deposit the Author Accepted Manuscript (AAM) in a repository, like [PubMed Central](#) or [Zenodo](#), with an open license. For more information review the [Grantee Repository Guide](#).

	<b>Post a Preprint</b> Publish your work as a preprint in a <a href="#">recognized preprint server</a> , such as <a href="#">VeriXiv</a> or <a href="#">bioRxiv</a>
	<b>Acknowledge the foundation</b> Acknowledge the foundation and include your grant number
	<b>Select a CCBY License</b> Ensure your work is available immediately and licensed CC BY (or equivalent)
	<b>Include a Data Availability Statement</b> Include a Data Availability Statement that describes where the underlying data can be found

## ALTERNATIVES TO ARTICLE PROCESSING CHARGES

To comply with the foundation's Open Access Policy, grantees need to post a preprint or deposit their AAM in PubMed Central (PMC). Neither of these routes has a cost to the grantee.

The 2025 Open Access Policy does NOT restrict where and how grantees can publish their work once they have posted a preprint. If a grantee chooses to publish their funded research in a journal that charges Article Processing Charges (APCs), the foundation will no longer pay these fees for submissions after January 1, 2025.
