# How to post a Preprint

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1ST, 2025, ALL GRANTEES ARE REQUIRED TO POST THEIR FUNDED MANUSCRIPT AS A PREPRINT IN A RECOGNIZED PREPRINT SERVER.

## **Acknowledge the Gates Foundation**

Be sure to include the following acknowledgement in your preprint:

"This work was supported, in whole or in part, by the Gates Foundation [Grant number]. The conclusions and opinions expressed in this work are those of the author(s) alone and shall not be attributed to the Foundation. Under the grant conditions of the Foundation, a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 License has already been assigned to the Author Accepted Manuscript version that might arise from this submission. Please note works submitted as a preprint have not undergone a peer review process."

## **Choose a Preprint server**

Publish your work as a preprint in one of the many recognized preprint servers, such as <u>bioRxiv</u>, <u>medRxiv</u>, and <u>VeriXiv</u>, a verified preprint platform that improves research integrity while enabling the rapid availability of research. Visit <u>ASAPbio</u> for a comprehensive list of recognized preprint servers.

#### Select a CC BY License

Choose a <u>Creative Commons Attribution license</u> (<u>CC BY</u>) or equivalent terms. A CC BY License is a <u>Creative Commons</u> license that enables users to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, so long as attribution is given to the creator.

#### **Include a Data Availability Statement**

Describe where the underlying data for the funded manuscript can be found in a Data Availability Statement. The Open Access Policy requires that the data underlying published research results is accessible and open immediately. # **ABOUT PREPRINTS**



## What is a Preprint?

A preprint is a scientific manuscript that has not yet been accepted by a journal and is uploaded by the authors to a public server.

## **Benefits of Preprints**

By posting funded manuscripts early as a preprint, authors establish primacy with a fully citable version. Authors retain full control of when their work will be disseminated and bypass the lengthy publishing timelines that can delay access. Authors receive feedback and commentary on their preprint and then publish updated versions. Preprints are free to post and update.

#### Remember

If a preprint has not been posted before article acceptance, grantees should deposit the Author Accepted Manuscript (AAM) in a repository, like <u>PubMed Central</u> or <u>Zenodo</u>, with an open license. For more information review the <u>Grantee Repository</u> Guide.
